SEED Explores Washington DC

Students to Experience History

S.E.E.D. (Sophomores Excel Explore Develop), a yearlong sophomore leadership program offering dedicated leadership development and training, is traveling to Washington DC on an academic exploration. The trip includes visiting the Holocaust Museum, the African American Museum, US Capital, and the Supreme Court.

This semester the program's studies focused on teaching about the Holocaust. One of the most powerful ways to teach about the Holocaust is to hear the voices of survivors and to read first-hand personal accounts including biographies and personal stories that connect the historical pieces to lives and experiences.

Issues of conformity, propaganda, intolerance, and especially the dangers of silence and apathy will be discussed during the trip.

S.E.E.D. leaves for Washington DC on Friday, April 13, returning to Fisher on Monday, April 16.
